Nearest the pins were Steve Glover, Dick Hudson and Simon Smith while Graham Moore won the putting.

<u>Day 2 of the women's championships</u> was played Wednesday in cold, wet and windy conditions. Although Liz Hobday didn't play as well as last week her 91 off the stick was enough to equal the best gross score for the day with Sandra Williams. Liz has maintained her 7-shot lead ahead of Sandra.

In B Grade, Jan Frater's lead has dropped to 1 shot with Julie Clark closing the 3 shot gap from round 1.

In C Grade, Julie McRae is almost unbeatable after increasing her lead over 2nd placed Lyn O'Brien.

Julie also has maintained her big lead in the overall nett competition with the next placed Sandra Williams 12 shots behind.

The women are set down to **complete their Championships next Wednesday** but that may need to be reviewed depending on the course recovery.

Allen Bujack was best in <u>Thursday's 12-hole comp</u> with 28 points. Herb Cox and Kevin Campbell were next best with 25 points. Ken Austin was nearest the pin and Gordon Dean won the putting in a 4-way countback.

Friday's comps were washed out.

The men's championships were postponed after heavy rain made the bottom 9 unplayable. Competition for <u>Saturday was changed to a par</u> and more than 40 players took part playing the top 9 twice. Aaron Coleman was the winner when he finished with an impressive +5. He was followed by Jeremy Tickle, + 3, lan Jeffery and Rowan Butler +2 and John Stansfield, Harley Tickle and David Hawker with +1. Best for the women was Sandy Cook with -1.

Rowan Butler was the winner of <u>Sunday's medley stableford</u> with 39 points. Steve Glover and Matt Penberthy finished with 35 points.

In an update of the men's progressive rounds. Taking the best 5 rounds of the 6 rounds played, Tony Baldwin has jumped to the lead of the Hoyt Family Trophy. Adam Paton and John Coote are 2 shots back and Geoff Caban and Steve Kent another 4 behind.
